MAFAC Recommendations - July 2020

Letters to the Secretary:

Establishing a National Seafood Council: Report and Recommendations from MAFAC

Question posed to MAFAC in 2018:

What can NOAA Fisheries can do to help increase consumer confidence and consumption of U.S. seafood?



Fish and Seafood Promotion Act (FSPA)

MAFAC assessed the FSPA possibilities

- Conducted 53 interviews with the Seafood Community
 - Regional coverage
 - Industry sector and trade organization coverage











- 2. Evaluated the Fish & Seafood Promotion Act
 - Learned from advisors with experience in commodity boards

MAFAC Recommendation

Reestablishment of an industry-led National Seafood Council using revised FSPA language





Summary of Major Recommendations

Industry-led with a clear mission and purpose

 to promote the U.S. seafood community and conduct education, research, promotion, and marketing

Focus on U.S. seafood as a whole, including both wild-capture fisheries and aquaculture.

The Seafood Council would present a unified voice; consistent, common, positive messaging; conduct direct marketing; and share stories about the industry from boat to consumer.



Summary of Major Recommendations

Be **accountable and transparent** through measuring of metrics, regular evaluation, and dissemination of information.

Funded by Congress initially, with no less than \$10M annually, but to be fully successful, funding should be \$25M or more annually, with plan to build sustainability with industry support in the future.

Council membership should be limited to 17, with very broad representation
