Applying Information Law to Electronic Monitoring Data & Supporting Guidance in U.S Fisheries

Final Procedural Directive 04-115-04



Key feedback on Draft Directive (July 2021)

- Obscuring PII and/or BII, release of still imagery vs video
- Clearer connection between application law and third party reporting requirements
- Clarity on determining when EM data becomes a Federal record
 E.g. Contracting and grants or remotely accessed records
- Clarity on who is the "submitter" fishing vessel vs EM service provider
- Applicability to scientific research surveys and pilot projects
- Clarity on process for acquiring data managed by a third party

Next Steps & Implementation Guidance

- Final directive published May 2022
- Develop appropriate regulations and guidance for EM programs
- EM programs should examine current practices, data collected under pilot

¹NOAA Fisheries would include a requirement in any contract or financial assistance award to maintain the confidentiality of EM data.

Entity is a recipient of a grant or is a party to a cooperative agreement.

³Given applicability of MSA §402(b), NOAA Fisheries expects regulations for an industry-funded EM program to require that third parties have a means to protect EM data.

⁴Does not apply if the EM data are stored on a non-NOAA system. Any EM data stored on a NOAA system would be subject to the FRA and FOIA.

⁵By default, NOAA Fisheries would not include a provision in a contract or federal financial assistance award to require that the EM data be stored on a NOAA system. However, Section III.1.A. provides clarity on when NOAA Fisheries would consider requiring that the EM data be maintained on a NOAA system.

Monitoring Third Party Performance

- Authority established by FMP and implementing regulations, and generally means species managed under MSA, MMPA, and ESA
- Monitor third party performance of service and data quality standards

Remote record access provides direct access to EM data to NOAA Fisheries
• Program would need a process for NOAA Fisheries to acquire a copy of any record used in official business (could be only certain trip EM data, e.g. single fishing haul)

Third party must retain original record submitted, per EM program

requirements

Access to and Use of EM Information

- Any agency record may be used for agency business to carry out functions under MSA, and other authorities such as MMPA and ESA
- NOAA Fisheries' employees or other federal agencies may need to sign non-disclosure statements to access and use MSA confidential data
- Analysts may observe events that would be forwarded onto the Office of Law Enforcement for further investigation (E.g. harassment of a marine mammal or an observer)
 - NOAA Fisheries may refer information to the U.S. Coast Guard or other appropriate agencies for further investigation if an exception to MSA 402(b) authorizes such disclosure

Subgroup 1: Reference points

- Guidelines for estimation of Fmsy, Bmsy, and their proxies
- Limited advice on additional considerations
 - Data-limited situations
 - Reference points under changing prevailing conditions
- Draft in development

Subgroup 3: Data-Limited ACLs

- Tech Memo: "Managing with ACLs for data-limited stocks in federal fishery management plans - Review and recommendations for implementing 50 CFR 600.310(h)(2) flexibilities for data limited stocks"
- Addressing comments with target to finalize by Fall 2022



Best Scientific Information Available

- BSIA procedural directive finalized May 2019.
- By May 2022, each Region Center Council group should develop a regional BSIA framework.
 - Identify general timelines, roles, and be publicly available.
- Applying framework ensures that management decisions are based on BSIA.

Executive Order 13921 Promoting American Seafood Competitiveness and Economic Growth





Executive Order 13921, Section 4

- In May 2020, NMFS requested all Councils submit a prioritized list of actions to "reduce burdens on domestic fishing and to increase production within sustainable fisheries".
- On behalf of DOC, NMFS continues to add recommended regulatory actions to the Unified Agenda (UA) as Councils take final actions.
 - Examples:
 - Amendment 22 to the Mackerel, Squid, and Butterfish Fishery Management Plan (Fall 2021 UA)
 - Regulatory Amendment To Remove Processing Restrictions on Squid and Sculpin Species in the Gulf of Alaska and Bering Sea and Aleutian Islands Groundfish Fisheries (Spring 2021 UA)
- Recommendations were evaluated by NMFS HQ and Regions, and were shared internally to inform development of a National Seafood Strategy.
