



## Many steps before funding is available

### **Budget Preparation and Review**

#### **Budget Planning**

Budget planning, priorities guidance.

Budget Formulation - President's Budget Request

Guidance from NOAA, DOC, and OMB is provided to formulate the budget.
Budget request to Congress is released the 1st Monday in February.

### **Congressional Action**

#### Hearings & Mark-ups

Congress deliberates on the budget request typically through the spring and summer.

#### **Appropriations**

An appropriation bill is provided prior to the start of the fiscal year (Oct. 1).

### **Budget Execution**

#### **Apportionment**

After the budget is appropriated, an apportionment must be signed to allow distribution of funds for obligation.


#### **Rescissions & Other Costs**

From the appropriated amounts, agencies are subject to rescissions and other costs that must be accounted for before arriving at the funding available for a specific program or project.



## FY 2022 Council Funding Status






## NOAA's 2022 COVID-19 Return to Workplace

## NOAA's Reintegration Plan

- No longer use phasing (1-3) based on COVID-19 transmission rates
- Removed pre-set occupancy limits and mission restrictions
  - Onsite access available: all missions, all personnel
- Location specific COVID-19 mitigations
  - New CDC COVID-19 Community Levels
    - HIGH, MEDIUM, LOW
    - Basis: Hospital admissions for COVID / newly reported COVID-19 cases in an area in the past 7 days
