

The Federal Budget Timeline





Many steps before funding is available

Budget Preparation and Review

Budget Planning

Budget planning, priorities guidance.

Budget Formulation -President's Budget Request

Guidance from NOAA, DOC, and OMB is provided to formulate the budget. Budget request to Congress is released the 1st Monday in February. **Congressional Action**

Hearings & Mark-ups

Congress deliberates on the budget request typically through the spring and summer.

Appropriations

An appropriation bill is provided prior to the start of the fiscal year (Oct. 1).

Budget Execution

Apportionment

After the budget is appropriated, an apportionment must be signed to allow distribution of funds for obligation.

Rescissions & Other Costs

From the appropriated amounts, agencies are subject to rescissions and other costs that must be accounted for before arriving at the funding available for a specific program or project.

Allocation & Allotment

Funding becomes available

FY 2018 -- Continuing Resolution

- Current CR is active through March 23, 2018.
- Operating at FY 2017 levels, less a ~0.7% rescission
- Typical CR rules, such as:
 - No new starts or terminations
 - o Contract activity can continue
 - o Grants can be awarded
 - Maintain operations, services and program activities at levels consistent with FY 2017, though final appropriation could potentially be at a lower funding level than FY 2017.




FY 2018 Councils Funding

- Each Councils received a release of funds under the on going CRs in Q1
 - A second release will bring each of your FY18 funding levels to ~50% of the anticipated FY18 total [administrative budget line]
 - We anticipate that this second release will be to all Councils on or about March 9.
- All other budget lines on the Council Table will be released after a full Appropriation.






